



## MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELOR/EDUCATOR

The Coalition for the Prevention of Native American Youth Suicide is seeking credentialed Native American counselors and/or educators to assist in training Native American youth in peer leadership. You will be responsible to assist in interviewing and selecting youth (12-16) with leadership skills and to train them in the Flying With Eagles curriculum.

Once trained these “credentialed” young leaders return to their communities to spearhead organized outreach efforts, engaging other youth in their community and helping them deal with the various challenges they face on a daily basis.

From this “train-the-trainer” program, you will be responsible to teach these youth how to lead community workshops using the Flying With Eagles curriculum.

Applicants must have a background in working with youth, focusing on the areas of suicide, and, substance and physical abuse along with an extensive and in-depth knowledge of Native American traditions. These training sessions occur throughout the year in various areas. A bachelor’s level degree in counseling, psychology, social work or related field and at least one year post-bachelor experience working in a setting relating to the fields of suicide prevention and/or substance abuse are required.
